Did you know?

To adopt a child under 24 months of age the provincial waiting period can be as long as eight years ("In Care and Adoption - Children, Seniors and Social Development", 2022).

To become a client of the NL Fertility Clinic you must:

- Get a referral from an OBGYN or a family doctor.
- -Before a client can undergo IVF or IUI, they will have to undergo diagnostic testing, including blood tests and ultrasounds, to assess their cycle and fertility (Fertility Options In Newfoundland Labrador, 2020).

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NL Fertility Services

In Newfoundland and Labrador we have one fertility clinic. For many fertility services you must leave the province and go to a clinic that the NL clinic partners with. There are even some procedures you can start here in NL and then go to a partner fertility clinic to help save on the amount of time needed to out of the province.

Newfoundland & Labrador offers:

- Adoption
- IUI treatments
- IVF (out of province travel is required to complete the embryo transfer)
- Fertility preservation

Cost associated

There are many costs associated with fertility. One key cost involved is travel. Some fertility options are not offered here in Newfoundland and Labrador thus travel outside of the province may be necessary. The cost of procedures can also be quite high.
